

Four Years Under Graduate Programmes with Honours or Honours with research offered by the college for Academic year 2023-24 under NEP 2020.

Moolji Jaitha (Autonomous) College is one of the renowned college in Khandesh region. It is an autonomous college, affiliated to KBC North Maharashtra University. The nation's education policy 2020 is being implemented for the first time by the college in the jurisdiction of KBC North Maharashtra University region. The UGC has revised the CBCS and developed a new Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF) for undergraduate and post graduate programmes. New Education Policy (NEP) is being implemented by the Indian government's ministry of human resource development (MHRD) beginning with the 2023–24 academic year.

Objectives of NEP 2020

- 1. To promote holistic development of students having the world view of a truly global citizen.
- 2. To provide flexibility to students so that learners have the ability to choose their learning trajectories and programmes, and thereby choose their paths in life according to their talents and interests.
- 3. To eliminate harmful hierarchies among disciplines/fields of study and silos between different areas of learning.
- 4. Multidisciplinary and holistic education to ensure the unity and integrity of all knowledge.
- 5. To promote creativity and critical thinking and to encourage logical decision-making and innovation.
- 6. To promote ethics and human & Constitutional values.
- 7. To promote multilingualism and the power of language in learning and teaching.
- 8. To impart life skills such as communication, cooperation, teamwork, and resilience.
- 9. To promote outstanding research as a corequisite for outstanding education and development.
- 10. To incorporate Indian Knowledge System relevant for a particular discipline or field of studies.

Under NEP, various courses to be learn by student are categorised under the following heads:-

- Course: A basic unit of education and/or training. It means a paper which is taught for at least one semester as a part of a subject and is a component.
- Major DSC (Mandatory): The subject represents the main focus of the degree, and the degree will be awarded in that subject. Students should secure a minimum of 50% of total credits through Major (core) Courses (mandatory courses, electives, vocational courses, Internship/ Field Projects / Apprenticeship / Community Engagement Projects, Seminars, and Group Discussions. In addition, Entrepreneurship, IPR and Research Projects shall be offered in case of Honors with Research Degree) in Three/Four Years for the award of a Major Degree. Major Specific IKSis included under Major.
- Elective Course DSE: Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
- Minor: is the subject that may complement the Major subject or can have interdisciplinary bandwidth. Minor subjects may be related or unrelated to the Major subject. The Minor subjects may be from the different disciplines of the same DSC Major (Core) faculty or from different faculty altogether.
- **GE/OE:** An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek multidisciplinary exposure is called a Generic Elective. It is to be chosen compulsorily from faculty other than that of the Major and from the faculty-wise baskets of OE prepared by Colleges.

- VESC: vocational andskill enhancement courses include
 - SEC (Skill Enhancement Courses) and
 - VSC (vocational skill courses), to be selected from the basket of Skill Courses approved by Colleges. These courses aim to provide students with hands-on training, competencies, proficiency and skills. The courses are expected to enhance skill and employability.
- AEC (Ability Enhancement Courses): includes English: 04Credits, Modern Indian Language: 04 credits
- VEC (Value Education Courses): to be chosen from the courses, such as; Understanding India, Environmental Science/Education, Digital and Technological Solutions, the Constitution of India, Ethics and Value Education
- IKS (Indian Knowledge system): Courses on IKS to be selected from the basket of IKS courses approved by the college. The course is based on the Indian Knowledge system, such as historical accounts of science in India, ancient Ayurveda,

- CC (Co-curricular Courses): to be chosen from the courses, such as; Health and Wellness, Yoga education, Sports and fitness, Cultural Activities, NSS/NCC and Fine/Applied/Visual/Performing Arts.
- Research Project/ Dissertation: Project work is considered a special course involving the application of knowledge in solving / analyzing / exploring a real-life situation / difficult problem. The student undertakes Research in specific areas of his Major/ Core Subject with advisory support from a teacher/faculty member

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC):

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) is the initiative of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) and Ministry of Education (MoE) respectively. As per National Education Policy 2020, the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) has been envisage, to facilitate the academic mobility of students with the freedom to study across the higher education institutions in the country with an appropriate "credit transfer" mechanism from one programme to another, leading to attain a Degree/ Diploma/ PG diploma, etc.,

Admission Path at Different Levels for Four-year Multidisciplinary Degree Programme

a. First Year Entry 1, Level 4.5

- Students who have successfully completed the Grade 12 School Leaving Certificate or equivalent shall be eligible for admission to a first-year degree programme.
- The entry requirement for Level 4.5 is the Secondary School Leaving Certificate obtained after completing Grade 12 or Level 4 successfully.
- A programme of study leading to entry into the first year of the Bachelor's degree is open to those who have met the entrance requirements, including specified levels of attainment at the secondary level of education specified in the programme admission regulations of the respective university.
- Admission to the Bachelor's degree programme is based on the evaluation of documentary evidence (including the academic record) of the applicant's ability to undertake and complete a Bachelor's degree programme.
- The admission shall be made on merit based on criteria notified by the university, keeping in view the guidelines/norms issued by the UGC, the government of Maharashtra and other statutory bodies concerned and taking into account the reservation policy as and when issued by the Government of Maharashtra from time to time.

b. 2nd year Entry 2 Level 5.0

- The entry requirement for Level 5.0 is a certificate obtained after completing the undergraduate programme's first year (two semesters).
- A programme of study leading to the second year of the Bachelor's degree is open to those who have met the entrance requirements, including specified levels of attainment, in the programme admission regulations.
- Admission to a programme of study is based on the evaluation of documentary evidence (including the academic record) of the

applicant's ability to undertake and complete a bachelor's degree programme.

c. 3rd year Entry 3 Level 5.5

- The entry requirement for Level 5.5 is a diploma obtained after completing two years (four semesters) of the undergraduate programme.
- A programme of study leading to the Bachelor's degree is open to those who have met the entrance requirements, including specified levels of attainment, in the programme admission regulations.
- Admission to a programme of study is based on the evaluation of documentary evidence (including the academic record) of the applicant's ability to undertake and complete a bachelor's degree programme.

d. 4th year Entry 4 Level 6 (P.G. First year)

- An individual seeking admission to a Bachelor's degree (Honours) and Bachelor's degree (Research) (Level 6) in a specified field of learning would generally have completed all requirements of the relevant three-year Bachelor's degree (Level 5.5).
- Therefore, after completing the three-year Bachelor's degree requirements, candidates who meet the minimum CGPA of 7.5 or the minimum eligibility criteria decided by the University Academic Council shall be allowed to continue studies in the fourth year of the undergraduate programme to pursue and complete the Bachelor's degree with Research.

Master's Programme Admission Path

- Students shall be admitted to a two-year programme, with the second year devoted entirely to research for those who have completed the three-year Bachelor's programme.
- Students completing a four-year bachelor's programme with Honours/Research may be admitted to a one-year Master's programme.
- e. 5th year Entry 5 Level 6.5 (P.G. Second

Year)

The admission requirements for Entry 5, level 6.5 is as given below:

- A four year Bachelor's Degree (Honours/Research) for the one-year/two-semester Master's degree programme.
- A three year Bachelor's Degree for the twoyear/four-semester Master's degree programme with an exit option after successful completion of the first year of PG Programme.
- o A three year Bachelor's Degree for the oneyear/two-semester Post-Graduate Diploma programme.

A programme of study leading to the Master's degree and Post-Graduate Diploma (PGD) is open to those who have met the entrance requirements, including specified levels of attainment, in the programme admission regulations. Admission to a programme of study is based on the evaluation of documentary evidence (including the academic record) of the applicant's ability to undertake post-graduate study in a specialized field of enquiry.

Lateral Entry/ Re-entry at Higher Levels after Exit from Lower Levels of Four Year Multidisciplinary UG Degree Programme

- Students who leave with a Certification, Diploma, or a Basic Bachelor's Degree will be eligible to re-enter the programme at the exit level to complete or progress to the next level through lateral entry mode.
- Any consequential vacancies caused by exits to an ongoing programme (four-year Degree Programme and Integrated Master's or second year Master's) plus vacancies created due to % failure in the previous year.
- Lateral entry is open to those students if he/she has either
- a. Successfully completed the first year/second year/third year of the particular four year multidisciplinary degree programme in any ABC registered HEI with valid credits in ABC and re-entering into the second year/third

year/fourth year, respectively of the same four year degree programme of any ABC registered HEI, within stipulated/ permissible period of years as decided by Statutory Councils of that HEI

b. Already successfully completed a multidisciplinary four-year first-degree programme and is desirous of and academically capable of pursuing another multidisciplinary four year first-degree programme in an allied subject.

A student will be allowed to enter/re-enter only during the odd semester. Re-entry at various levels for lateral entrants in academic programmes should be based on the earned and valid credits as deposited and accumulated in Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) through Registered Higher Education Institutions (RHEI) and proficiency test records. Hence, the University/ College will have to work out prerequisites and entry norms for lateral admissions, such as previous year CGPA, a written test and/or interview, requirement of bridge courses etc. In case the lateral entrant is desirous of joining four year degree programme different from his/her earlier programme (i.e. with different combinations of Major and Minor), then the BoS of that HEI should decide the requirements of bridge courses, prerequisite courses and additional credit requirements for new combinations of Major and Minor which the lateral entrant must fulfil for the purpose of joining the new programme. However, in terms of the admission eligibility requirements, the student must belong to the same faculty/ discipline in terms of Major Subject i.e., the Major subject of his/her earlier programme and the Major subject of a new programme for which he/she is seeking admission must be from the same faculty/discipline. Reservation for lateral entry will have to be executed as per the Government of Maharashtra Norms.

Bachelor of Science

1) Physics 2) Chemistry 3) Biology 4) Mathematics 5) Geography shall be eligible for admission to the F.Y. B.Sc. Refund of Fees

Vide circular No. 126/2003 from North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon refund of fees shall be as given under.

- 1. If a student leaves the college within 7 days from the date of his/her admission, except admission fee remaining tuition fee & other fee will be deducted by 10%.

Allocation of seats

The percentage of allocation of seats for various types of candidates in the Home University (HU), Other than Home University (OHU), Institutional (Management) Quota, and Industry Sponsored Seats is as follows:

- Candidates graduated from KBCNMU, Jalgaon: 70%
- Candidates graduated from other universities: 10%
- Seats to be allotted through management quota: 20% Industry sponsored seats: one (01) seat for first ten (10) intake capacities subject to maximum two per course.

Admission procedure for industry sponsored candidates:

- 1) For application under industry sponsored quota, it is mandatory to fill online application form.
- 2) After the CAP rounds, candidates with industry sponsorship may apply under the industry sponsored quota with a letter of sponsorship from the industry.
- 3) Admission under industry sponsored quota will be done purely on the basis of merit list prepared by the college.

Reservations:

All the reservations given below shall be applicable to candidates belonging to Maharashtra state only subject to the fulfilment of the eligibility criteria specified by respective authorities from time to time.

(a) Reservation for backward class category candidates: The percentage of seats reserved for candidates of backward class categories belonging to Maharashtra state is as given below. The percentage of reservation is the percentages of the seats available for Maharashtra candidates. Backward class candidates shall claim the category to which they belong to at the time of submission of application form.

Reservation for wards of defence service personnel: Five percent (5%) seats out of total sanctioned intake capacity of colleges as a whole separately, subject to a maximum of one (01) seat in each subject coming under admission procedure shall be reserved for wards of ex- service personnel who are from Maharashtra state.

Reservation for persons with disability candidates: Five percent (5%) seats of total sanctioned intake capacity of college as a whole separately, subject to a maximum of one (01) seat in subject coming under admission procedure shall be reserved for candidates with disability.

The allotment of seats reserved for the candidates with disability shall be done on the basis of merit. The candidates claiming reservation under this category shall submit the Physical Disability certificates.

Note: - Candidates with disability should note that on admission to degree course they will not be given any exemptions or additional facility in the academic activities other than those which may be provided by the college.

If the reservation quota remains vacant then 2% seats of total intake capacity of college as a whole separately will be offered to SBC category.

Reservation for EWS (Economical Weaker Section) Candidate: As per the provisions in Government Resolution No. राजाधो 4019/प्र.क्र.31/16-अ, dated 12thFebruary, 2019, 10% seats shall be reserved for EWS candidates. These seats shall be filled by the Competent Authority through admission procedure as per the policies of the Government declared from time to time.

If sufficient candidates from Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhari North Maharashtra University area are not available for admission for various post graduate courses, candidates from other universities will be considered. Similarly, if candidates from other universities are not available for admission, the candidates from Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhari North Maharashtra University will be considered for admission. There will be separate merit list for other university students.

Any change from Government side in terms of reservation before the commencement of admission procedure Round -I will be taken under consideration.

Candidate once admitted through industry sponsored quota will not be allowed to shift to general quota under any circumstances.

Eligibility criterions

- General criteria: A candidate is considered to be eligible for admission to the post graduate courses offered by college, if he/she has secured at least 50% (or equivalent CGPA) marks at graduation (45% marks for backward class i.e. SC/ST/DT/NT/OBC/SBC category candidates from Maharashtra state).

Disciplinary Rules

ANTI-RAGGING

According To Ugc Regulations on Curbing The Menace of Ragging In Higher Educational Institutions, 2009.

Administrative action in the event of ragging.:

- The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed hereinunder:
- a) The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;
- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding/ withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.
- iv. Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.

- vi. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- vii. Cancellation of admission.
- viii. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- ix. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie,
- i. in case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University; 21
- ii. in case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor.
- iii. in case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution, as the case may be.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT CONTROLLING MEASURES Rules Relating To Complaints And Grievances of Women Regarding Sexual Harassment At The Work Place Under University Statute

Sexual Harassment at the Workplace means and includes: Unwelcome sexually- determined behavior (whether directly or by implication) such as – (a) Physical Contact and advances (b) A Demand and request for Sexual Favours (c) Sexually-Coloured Remarks (d) Showing pornography (e) Any Other Unwelcome Physical, Verbal or Non-Verbal Conduct of a Sexual Nature (f) Any conduct which is humiliating a woman

Penalties And Punishment For Sexual Harassment -

- The committee shall impose and/or recommend penalty to a person found guilty of sexual harassment.
- 2. Any employee or student found guilty of sexual harassment shall be liable to be punished.
- The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor will take decision regarding filing of criminal complaint against the concerned person as he deems fit.
- 4. A person found guilty of "sexual harassment" shall be subject to the same penalties for major and minor misconduct as is prescribed under the Statutes of the University for the teaching staff and as per the Standard Code for the non-teaching staff.
- 5. A student found guilty of sexual harassment shall be liable to receive the following penalties-

Minor Penalties-

(I) Warning (ii) Written apology

(iii) Bond of good behavior (iv) Debarring entry into a hostel/campus (v) Suspension for a specified period of time (vi) Withholding results.

Major Penalties-

- (i) Debarring from examinations
- (ii) Expulsion from University/College/Institution
- any person under suspension and /or for prohibiting him from entering the premises or for imposing a penalty shall be communicated to the University, affiliated or autonomous college/s, autonomous institution /s or department /s or recognized institution /s and the concerned Management, it shall also be communicated to the person making the complaint and the person against whom the complaint is made; the direction shall be complied with the University or the Management concerned, as the case may be, within two weeks from the date of communication.
- In an extreme case of physical assault or rape, the person charged will be immediately suspended until the completion of the inquiryand police complaint also be lodged.
- The Disciplinary Authority in respect of the employee working in the University shall be the Vice-Chancellor.
